NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Public Local Inquiries will be held into:

- a) the Secretary of State for Transport's proposals for the Orders listed 1 to 4 above;
- b) the objections which have been made in connection with these proposals.

A person nominated by the Planning Inspectorate will hold Public Local Inquiries into the Orders listed above.

NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN that in accordance with Rule 5(2) of the Highways (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 1994 and Rule 4(a) of the Compulsory Purchase (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 2007, a local Pre-Inquiries Meeting will be held into the Secretary of State's proposal for the Orders listed above by the person nominated to hold the Public Local Inquiries at a time, date and venue to be advised. All persons with an interest in the Public Local Inquiries are invited to attend.

It is requested that any person who intends at the inquiries to submit –

- (a) that any highway or proposed highway to which any of the draft Orders relates should follow an alternative route, or
- (b) that instead of improving, diverting or altering a highway to which a draft Order relates, a new highway should be constructed on a particular route

shall send to the A453 Widening Team at the address given below not later than 25 June 2009 sufficient information about the alternative route or the route of the new highway to enable it to be identified. If you intend to submit such a proposal, would you please notify the A453 Widening Team of your intention by 11 June 2009. If you have already submitted such a proposal, then you do not have to submit it again.

Please note that any objection, representation or statement of support may be disclosed to anyone directly affected by it. There are other circumstances where these, together with the associated correspondence, may be made public. Some weeks before the inquiry, the Agency will pass copies of all unresolved objections, representations and

statements of support, together with related correspondence, to the Inspector. This correspondence will be available for inspection during the inquiry. It will be made available before the inquiry opens if it forms part of a Statement of Case or if the Inspector asks for this to be done. In addition, information contained in an objection, representation or statement of support may be made available if a request is made for that information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The Secretary of State for Transport will publish a further notice which will be in accordance with Rule 10 of the Highways (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 1994 in the case of the Orders numbered 1 to 3 above, and Rule 11 of the Compulsory Purchase (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 2007 in the case of the Order numbered 4 above. That notice will also include details of the Orders which are the subject of the public inquiries and explain the procedures to be followed for anyone who wishes to appear and to give evidence or submit alternative proposals.
